Claire completed over 23 hours of community service by preparing and hiding eggs and serving as the Easter Bunny for our community Easter Egg Hunt. She also served refreshments and helped set up and tear down for the Halloween Parade. Not only did Claire earn community service hours for Huntington Hills but as a member of North's National Honor Society. She volunteered at the Farmer's Market, at scheduling days at North where she greeted people, distributed paperwork, and gave tours of campus, and she provided childcare at Sycamore Creek Church during services. Safety in Huntington Hills

We receive many complaints about vehicles speeding and running through stop signs. The hill on Springbrook Drive going down to the park is of particular concern for speeding. Please obey the 25mph speed limit throughout the neighborhood and observe all traffic laws. Keep an eye out for residents walking or bicycling. School is back in session; watch out for children waiting for the bus, walking home and playing after school. Also, walkers, please be proactive and walk against traffic. At night, wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight. The Huntington Hills Bylaws require that each house have an outside yard light within five feet of the lot line. Please make sure your yard light is in good repair and lit at night. If you don't have a yard light, consider installing one for safety reasons and to be in compliance.

Dues

Annual dues enable the Trustees to successfully continue HHCA activities, property maintenance and needed improvements. Currently, our annual dues are \$45 due on May 1. Dues received after May 1 include a \$10 late fee and are \$55.

We are grateful that the overwhelming majority of Huntington Hills' homeowners pay their dues on time. However, there are currently 65 homeowners with a balance. If you are one of them, please make a payment and bring your account up to date.
