Understanding the deed resctrictions helps us maintain property values







Sometimes we forget and sometimes we simply aren't aware but we want to highlight periodically some common violations:



STREET PARKING
Street parking is only
permitted for 2 consecutive
hours. No overnight street
parking is permitted. This
is for pedestrian safety and
aesthetics.



BOATS/CAMPERS/RVS/ COMMERCIAL VEHICLES/ TRAILERS

All of the above including construction equipment, and mobile or stationary trailers are **permitted for only 72 hours per month** unless completely covered in your garage.

Maintaining the neighborhood benefits all of us. Deed restrictions are a positive.

Deed restrictions set parameters for how homeowners can use land and property, and what they can build on it. The developers of our community created these restrictions to help protect the home values.

If you have not had the opportunity to review the HHCA deed restrictions, I strongly encourage you to do so. They can be found online at Huntington-Hills.org or by contacting Garrett Untch our Vice President.

In general the restriction cover: * Standards for general maintenance of buildings and improvements

* Types of vehicles prohibited

for longer than 72 hours per month, which include boats, buses, campers, RV s, commercial vehicles, and large trucks

- * Types of fencing allowed (specifically building materials and fence heights)
- * Restrictions on sheds and detached workshops and garages that can be built

Ultimately, the responsibility for understanding deed restrictions falls upon the owner. Once a property sale is complete in Huntington Hills, the new owner is automatically a member of the Huntington Hills Civic Association with all the rights and responsibilities contained therein. In other words, homeowners are all subject to their deed restrictions.


