Huntington Hills Scholarship

The Andy Rominiecki Scholarship is awarded each year to a Huntington Hills high school senior. The winning student receives a \$1,100 tuition grant to use towards the advancement of their education. In order to qualify, each applicant must perform at least **16 hours of Community Service for Huntington Hills**. Students may earn Community Service Hours by participating in community activities such as the Halloween parade, Easter egg hunt, help with mailings, entrance maintenance, park cleanup and winter shoveling. Please contact any Trustee if you would like to participate in any of these activities. Students may begin earning hours in 7th grade. Applications are due by May 1, 2024 at 5 p.m. to Julie Wyatt at 6531 Riverton Circle. Since there were no applicants last year, this year two Scholarships may be awarded.
